Chair Franklin called the meeting of the San Marcos Community Services Commission to Order at 6:04 p.m.

REPORTS AND OTHER BUSINESS

4. San Marcos Rugby Report

Barry Zeait, San Marcos Rugby coordinator told the Commission he has been a resident of San Marcos since 2004 and has worked for the San Marcos School District since 2001. Barry noted that youth rugby is a sport that is coming up through the ranks for children and this sport has a growing need. Youth rugby is for children looking for a different type of sport and who are looking for something new.

Rugby 7's is an Olympic sport and many National team players live in San Diego and train at the Olympic Training Center in Chula Vista. There are 80 clubs in Southern California in the Youth Federation and within that there are 250 teams. Rugby is the second most played sport in the world just behind soccer. Barry has 22 players signed up to play. Because the club is in its infancy stage, those players are playing with the North County Rugby Club who are insured and have fields to use. In the summer Barry hopes to have a 7's team in place and then the following school year recruit high school students because he has been told the youth are asking for Rugby.

Kids from San Marcos have played a few games at Connors Park and it has been very well receive. It is a great facility to utilize and he is thankful for the opportunity to use it. Barry showed Commissioners pictures of the youth playing games.

Chair Franklin thanked Barry for his report.

Commissioner Maas asked if the teams are co-ed? Barry noted that they don't play co-ed: they have a boy's team and a girl's team. Staff noted ten and under plays co-ed and even up to 16 years old. Generally around 16-18 years old, the teams split and play separately. Commissioner Maas asked if the goal is to have Rugby be a high school sport. Barry noted right now CIF is not going to approve it as they are swamped with other requests and sports. Other states do have Rugby as a high school sport.

Chair Franklin asked what the projected growth in the next year or two? Barry is fortunate to have a pool of 5,000 students and he feels if he offers the program he could have 60-80 children playing the sport here in San Marcos.

Commissioner Crain asked if the other schools that have teams are club teams? Barry noted yes but it depends if the athletic director wants to back the sport and give them the fields to play. Those schools offer Rugby. Crain asked what size fields do they use to play? Barry noted a soccer field is perfect size and they don't need to do much adjustment to the existing lines.

5. Parks. Trails, Hikes, JP Nature Center Report

Ron Vinluan, Park Ranger, reported on the value of the Volunteer Rangers. We currently have 32 volunteers and they work anywhere from 2 – 20 hours per month. The value to the City is over \$61,000 in volunteer wages.

One of the Volunteer Ranger projects was to paint the sign at Double Peak and the Ridgeline Trailhead. Ron showed Commissioners a picture of the updated sign. Other volunteer projects include Mountain Shadows students volunteer to pick up trash and clean picnic tables at several heavily used parks. Eagle Scouts create kiosks for the parks, residents perform trail sweeping, and a Purple Heart Flag pedestal was installed at Walnut Grove Park.

Two additional part-time rangers were hired to assist with weekend park patrol and Nature Center back up. Hugh and Derek will assist with enforcing park and City trail ordinances and Hugh will assist with the monthly hikes while Derek will help with the Nature Center and the reptiles. The Nature Center has a new Director Cynthia Keiser who was hired to replace Susan LaJoie, who retired after ten years with the City. Cynthia's experience with local flora & fauna will help educate our volunteer rangers and docents.

New trail markers are being installed as we speak on the trails that were damaged in the fire. These markers will help guide trail visitors to find their way throughout the trail network.

Walnut Grove Park now has 12 horse corrals and 3 hose bibs to make the park more enjoyable experience for the equestrian visitors. Walnut Grove arena is the only public horse arena in the County.

Trails Day was rescheduled to be held in conjunction with the fire damaged trails opening on March 7th. The trails will open again to the public and the event will be held on March 7th at 9:00 am and registration starts at 8:30 am.

The Nature Center docents and volunteer rangers volunteer on Saturdays and now on Sundays to keep the Nature Center open to the public. The attendance is increasing because of this. The total number of visitors to the Nature Center was 2,935 in 2014.

Commissioner Maas asked what the QR Code on the new trail markers links to? Ron noted when you scan the QR Code it tells you what trail you're on, it directs you to the City website and also the Friends website, who contributed the funds for the trail markers.

Commissioner Maas asked how the Eagle Scout projects are determined? Ron noted he has a list of projects we need to be completed and they can also give suggestions.

Commissioner Maas has seen signage for Mountain Lion sittings and asked if there are any additional communication efforts we could make because of the proximity to the school. Ron noted he will get a call and we report it to DFW and they will visit the site and either confirms it or just file the information. Ron can contact the school when a sitting happens and he will be printing the dates on the signs to let hikers know when the mountain lion was sighted. Ron noted the last sitting was in December and then again in January so we kept the signage posted.

Commissioner Towsley thanked Ranger Ron for the incredible job he does with the part time staff and volunteer rangers. She visited the Jack's Pond Nature Center during a field trip and they keep the children very entertained. Towsley asked in the future to include previous year's numbers to have a benchmark.

Chair Franklin asked if we purchased any additional signs for ones that happen to walk away. Ron noted we don't have any extras but these new markers will be more difficult to take.

Vice Chair Lindsay noted the new signage looks great and thanked Ron for arranging that. Lindsay has had the chance to work with both the new rangers and they are doing an outstanding job.

6. Youth Sports Council Meeting Notes

Commissioner Mockus attended the meeting and JoAnne Shannon did bring up the discrepancy issue for their soccer registration numbers. James said they agreed on the January 15th date for registration numbers to be turned in, which was set by the Youth Sports Council (YSC). San Marcos Youth Soccer and San Marcos AYSO 127 fell short of the 80% residency mark so they were unable to vote during the first vote. The residency requirement was voted on and reduced from 80% to 70%. It was voted 6 in 1 in favor of changing the residency rate to 70% and to make this change in the bylaws.

James asked the YSC to think about setting a precedent for the minimum number of participants that a new organization should have to sit on a council. Other cities have numbers between 100 and 200 as their standard.

James spoke about the food truck and vendor policy reminding the YSC that any vendors need to get a permit through Community Services at least two weeks in advance. Banners are now permitted but need to be taken down by the expiration date. The next meeting is May 5th.

Chair Franklin noted the residency rate of 70% is now in line with the cities of Escondido, Oceanside, and Encinitas.

Commissioner Crain asked when the YSC significantly changes motions; doesn't the motion need to be voted on at the next month's meeting? Commissioner Mockus said that question came up at the meeting as well and the Council present said they were able to amend the motion that evening.

Commissioner Crain asked if there is a difference in the law with the City of San Marcos as far as requirements for food vendor permits versus at a park? Ranger Ron said any food vendor doing business in a City park needs a permit through Community Services. If they have a daily permit then they are able to be on the park property. The cost is \$100 a day and if it is a special event then they can get approval through the special event permitting process.

Commissioner Crain asked if Friends of San Marcos reports to the Commission? Staff noted they have not been asked to come to the Commission but staff will ask them if they would like to attend a Commission meeting to speak about their mission, vision, and values.

7. Trails Advisory Committee Meeting Notes (TAC)

Vice Chair Lindsay attended the TAC meeting and they discussed the Double Peak Trail status, what sections have been completed, and which are still being worked on. The telescope at Double Peak Park was a private donation to honor a professor at Cal State San Marcos and the pad the telescope sits on is showing wear, so they are looking for a way to maintain that before it deteriorates too far. They are looking at fundraising sources and suggested using Trails Day for that or they plan to approach a sealant company and offer them promotional opportunities.

Trails Day routes are still being worked out and the hike will begin at 9am and registration will start at 8am. CSUSM is sending some volunteers to help out and the HAM radio volunteers will also help out with the event.

The committee discussed the issues with the growing soccer use and the equestrian activity has increased so there is need to identify, perhaps through the update of the Master Parks Plan Walnut Grove Park Plan, how to deal with this mix up. One thing mentioned was the two parcels of land north of the park are under consideration and how they could be utilized.

There is also a planned development north of Deer Springs Road which could be impacted when the road is widened. There are quite a few issues for the planned usage and future development for Walnut Grove Park and Commission Lindsay wanted to make the Commission aware of this.

Chair Franklin remembers asking about a maintenance fund/trust to be set-up because the DG will tear up the pad. Staff noted that since the telescope was put in, original monies raised for the telescope were used for maintenance. Most recently \$2,000 was used to refinish the pad. The telescope is a City asset and we want to keep it as pristine as possible.

Commissioner Crain asked if the footprint and allocation of space in the last 5-7 years has changed? Crain has noticed some temporary holding pens that were put in along the soccer fence. Staff noted with the growth of the youth sports organizations many of the equipment has been stored on the equestrian pad area, including goals and some storage containers. The origin of how fields are set up has an indirect negative effect when soccer balls fly into the equestrian area. Staff is looking at a way of dealing with this so we can maximize our footprint with the sports component and also be good neighbors with the equestrian side. Netting, similar to what is at Connors Park, has been looked into and the estimates range from \$25,000 - \$40,000. Crain has used the park in both capacities and since 1999, when he moved back here, not much has changed other than the additional horse equipment and the second trailer that was added. The goals have been where they are forever and possibly use the dirt road as a line of demarcation to try and mediate any disputes that may be going on and to possibly open up some more facilities for horses.

Vice-Chair Lindsay speaking for the equestrian folks present at the meeting conveyed that as both soccer programs have been growing and looking for additional space so have they, and the equestrian area is the only public facility in the County.

The equestrian members on the committee pointed out how much equestrian demand there is and in the same sense we have spoken about hosting multiple sports tournaments at the park. The equestrian community has voiced the need for similar hosted events to be held and at the park and the current facility is relatively small for their needs. The issue is far bigger of an issue then just dividing up the space currently at the park.

ORAL COMMUNICATIONS

Report from the Community Services Director:

Staff noted The San Diego Surfers women's rugby club is holding a tournament Saturday, March 30th at Walnut Grove Park. The tournament will offer a youth tournament with 16 competing teams and the women's teams will have 40 teams participating.

The PAWS with Friends event will be held on April 25th and the event proceeds will benefit the parks and trails and will mostly go towards enhancing the dog parks in San Marcos.

Chair Franklin asked if and when the Commission will participate in the planning of the Master Park Plan? Staff noted a report will be coming to the Commission and we can also do a one hour interactive focus meeting with the Commission and Cathy Cronin.

Chair Franklin asked if we have any new information on the Richmar Park plan as the grant expires at the end of the year. Staff noted we are on track with the project and money was acquired for the restroom to be included with the park development.

Chair Franklin asked if we were able to get an ordinance comparison on other cities and the county deals with drones. Staff noted Ron Vinluan is researching this, as well as model airplanes, to have a recommendation for the Commission moving forward.

Commissioner Crain asked staff if he knows how many teams participating in the rugby tournament are from outside San Marcos and how it will potentially impact hotel reservations? Staff noted this is a private rental and teams are from the San Diego region. There are still teams signing up, and teams mostly from San Diego and Orange County will be participating. Commissioner Crain noted in other sports when you travel to a tournament outside your area the tournament requires that you book hotels.

Crain feels we should look into this as a way of stimulating our local economy. Staff noted all the tournaments receive an informational brochure as to where to shop, dine, and stay.

Commissioner Smith thanked Ron for his presentation and she visits Jack's Pond often and noted the park is always looking beautiful and clean.

Commissioner Maas thanked Ron for answering all her questions and she feels the parks and trails are a great offering for the community and thanked Ron for all he does.

Commissioner Lindsay mentioned the State of the City event will be held next Tuesday.

2014 COMMUNITY SERVICES SPORTS REPORT

BACKGROUND:

The F.H. "Corky" Smith Gymnasium is a 26,000 square foot facility that offers three regulation size basketball courts and a multipurpose room. The City sports division is located at the city gymnasium. The name **Courts & Sports** represents our official community sports office.

We currently have seven part-time clerk aides and three part-time sports coordinators under my supervision.

The city gymnasium lobby underwent an \$80,000 a renovation during summer 2012, that included new counters, paint, snack bar, mural, LCD monitor and flooring. The renovation was definitely needed as the city gymnasium serves as home base for our youth and adult sports programs throughout the calendar year. City adult league team registrations and many of the resident youth individual registrations are held at **Courts & Sports**.

Youth and adult sports groups are able to take advantage of our nearly year round ball fields at the following city parks: Bradley Park, Mission Sports Park, Cerro de Las Posas Park, San Elijo Park , Walnut Grove Park, Hollandia Park, Sunset Park and Connors Park.

All resident youth leagues need additional field space in which to effectively administer their programs for both practice and game facilities. Our department, in conjunction with San Marcos Unified School District and Palomar College assists in this fair and equitable field allocation for resident youth programs.

YOUTH SPORTS:

LEAGUES / PROGRAMS:

In 2013, we established the San Marcos Youth Sports Council (YSC) and the YSC policy and procedures manual to assist in the field allocation process. Even though we had challenges in 2014, the YSC has helped establish guidelines for all new groups and give each YSC member a forum to discuss possible improvements.

The following youth sports organizations comprise our YSC and offer local non-profit community programming. The YSC field allocations are divided into two seasons Spring / Summer (February-July) priority sports include baseball, softball, and lacrosse. The Fall / Winter (August-January) priority sports are soccer, football and rugby.

SPRING / SUMMER RESIDENT GROUPS

SAN MARCOS YOUTH BASEBALL: January - June

SMYB has access to city and school fields. Practices start in January with games played February - June. Official game field locations include: Mission Sports Park, San Marcos Middle School, Bradley, San Elijo and Hollandia Park. The program consists of over 1,000 participants.

SAN MARCOS GIRLS SOFTBALL: January - June

SMGS has access to city and school fields. Practices start in January with games played February - June. Official game field locations include: Bradley Park, San Elijo Park and Cerro de Las Posas Park. The program consists of over 300 participants.

SAN MARCOS LACROSSE/PROPEL: January - June

LACROSSE has access to city and school fields. Practices start in February and games are played March - May. Official game field locations include: San Elijo Park, San Elijo Middle and Elementary Schools. The program consisted of 150 + participants.

SPRING / SUMMER ARENA RESIDENT GROUPS

AYSO spring 2014 arena program had over 175 total participants. They use Bradley soccer arena.

SPRING / SUMMER RESIDENT GROUPS

SMYS spring 2014 arena program had over 950 total participants. They use both Bradley and Sunset Park soccer arenas.

FALL / WINTER RESIDENT GROUPS

SAN MARCOS AYSO and AYSO Matrix: July - December

SM AYSO has access to city and school fields. Practices start in August and games are played August - November. Official game field locations include: Walnut Grove Park, Cerro de Las Posas, Hollandia, Connors, SMMS and Palomar College. The program consisted of approx. 900-1,000 participants.

SAN MARCOS YOUTH SOCCER and REVOLUTION: July - December

SMYS has access to city and school fields. Practices start in August and games are played August - November. Official game field locations include: Walnut Grove Park, Cerro de Las Posas, Hollandia, Connors, SMMS and Palomar College. The program consisted of approx. 1,800-1,900 participants.

SAN ELIJIO AYSO: July - December

SE AYSO has access to city and school fields. Practices start in July and games are played August - November. Official game field locations include: San Elijo Park, Connors, San Elijo Middle and Elementary Schools. The program consisted of 900 –1,000 participants.

SAN MARCOS FC SOL: July - December

FC Sol has access to city and school fields. Practices are year round and games are played August - November. Official game field locations include: San Elijo Park, San Elijo Middle and Elementary Schools. The club had 220 total participants that formed 18 Club soccer teams and a Rec. development program for kids on Friday nights.

SAN MARCOS POP WARNER: July - December

SM Pop Warner has access to city and school fields. Practices start in July and games are played August - November. Official game field locations include: **SMHS, MHHS**, Bradley Park and Hollandia Park. The program consists of over 300-450 players /cheerleaders.

SAN MARCOS YOUTH BASKETBALL: November - February

SMYBB has full access to the gymnasium weekdays from 4pm to closing. Practices start November and games are played December - February. Games are played Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday's. The program consists of 1000 + participants.

SMYBB SHOOTING STARS: November - January

The Shooting Stars program is organized through SMYBB with play on Sunday afternoon. This program is for all special needs youth with able body youth assisting along side. Program consisted of 100 youth participants.

COASTAL ELITE BASKETBALL: March - May & September - November

Coastal Elite Basketball League is a club program / league, held twice during the year. The program includes 5th, 6th 7th & 8th Grade Divisions. Practices are held on week days with games played on Friday evenings city gymnasium.

YOUTH TOURNAMENT SPORTS GUIDE

Created in 2014, it provides out of town tournament participants information regarding fields, local hotels, restaurants and things to do.

ADULT SPORTS:

LEAGUES / PROGRAMS

The leagues below are offered three times during the calendar year. The Spring, Summer and Fall leagues are set up in a 10 game double round-robin regular season. All regular season league champs and runners-up proceed to post-season tournaments. Note: San Marcos is the only San Diego County Community Services Department offering three full seasons of play.

SOFTBALL:**2014 TEAM TOTALS****COED 125 Teams MEN'S 198 Teams = 323 TOTAL TEAMS****Average 108 Teams per season**

Our sports department hires and trains all of our softball officials. Over 30 part-time game officials are needed to officiate the games. The game officials are responsible for many other duties as well as officiating and keeping games on time. Game officials do a great job and most teams are satisfied as shown by their team's continued patronage.

ARENA SOCCER:**2014 TEAM TOTALS****COED 72 Teams MEN'S 60 Teams WOMEN'S 27 Teams****= 159 Teams average 53 Teams per season**

Officials are contracted from (SDCSRA) San Diego County Soccer Referees' Association and all are trained and certified yearly by the US Indoor Soccer Association. Game officials do a good job in a very physical and fast moving sport.

BASKETBALL:**2014 TEAM TOTALS****MEN'S 120 Teams average 40 Teams per season**

Officials are contracted from (NCBOA) North County Basketball Officials Association and all are trained and certified yearly by their Association.

VOLLEYBALL:**2014 INDIVIDUAL TOTALS****MEN'S 90 Individuals WOMEN'S 54 Individuals****Average 48 participants per season**

The coed program is contracted to Dick Leatherman, who has coordinated the program for many years at our facility. This nine week program runs 3 times a year.

OUTDOOR SOCCER CONTRACTUAL LEAGUES: **2014 TOTALS****NORTH COUNTY COMMUNITY SOCCER LEAGUE, LEONESA,****LATIN AMERICA SOCCER LEAGUE - 150-200 Teams**

These contractual leagues continue to grow. They play games at Palomar College Minkoff Field, Walnut Grove, and Bradley Park. The soccer leagues generate 100,000-125,000 in revenue.

ADULT SPORTS:**CONTRACTUAL ADULT LEAGUES**

The adult leagues below are set up as contractual leagues which pay park rental fees to offset their field use.

NORTH COUNTY COMMUNITY SOCCER LEAGUE:

NCCSL has access to city and school fields. Games are played year-round. Field rental locations include: Walnut Grove Park and Palomar College. Group is under the direction of Jesus Garcia as league president. Program has expanded to include arena play as well.

LEONESA SOCCER LEAGUE:

LEONESA has access to city fields . Games are played year-round. Field rental locations include: Bradley Park multi-purpose field and Arena. Group is under the direction of Eliseo Melendez as league president.

LATIN AND AMERICAN SOCCER ASSOCIATION:

LASA has access to city fields. Games are played year-round. Field rental location is Bradley Park. Group is under the direction of Marcos Sotelo as association president.

CAL STATE SAN MARCOS MENS AND WOMENS PROGRAMS

We host CSUSM men's & women's basketball practices August-April.

CSUSM INTERMURAL ARENA SOCCER PROGRAM:

Games will be played on Friday afternoons starting this February at the Sunset soccer arena. Program is under the direction of Hugo Lecomte - Director of Campus Recreation

CSUSM INTERMURAL BASKETBALL PROGRAM:

Games are played on Friday afternoons starting in February at the Corky Smith Gymnasium. Program is under the direction of Hugo Lecomte - Director of Campus Recreation

OTHER ADULT GROUPS / PROGRAMS:

Other adult programs include Pickle Ball and Volleyball weekdays 8:30am-1:00pm.


