4. SMYS Volunteer Recognition, Century Club

NOTE & FILE

San Marcos Youth Soccer does not pay referees and depends on volunteers to attend and arbitrate games. Tonight, there are three individuals who have volunteered to referee more than 100 games, over a period of five years; thus becoming members of the "Century Club".

**SMYS Volunteer Recognition, Century Club cont.**

- Edgar Almadin for 102 games refereed, averaging 20 games per season. SMYS is thankful for his kind and patient way with the kids, coaches, and for his dedication to the league.
- Michael Snow for 102 games refereed, averaging 20 games a season. Michael also coaches two teams every year and serves on the Board of Directors as the Director of Coaching.
- Mark Kubasak for 114 games refereed. Mark, who has been a soccer player since the age of 7, took on the responsibilities of volunteerism as a youth. From concession stand, to field setup and teardown; to being a TOP Soccer buddy for special needs players, he joins his father and brother in the Century Club. He is an inspiration to his peers for his sense of commitment and generosity to his community.

6. Youth Sports Council: June 7, 2016 meeting notes**NOTE & FILE**

Commissioner Smith reported on the meeting:

- July 11-16 Triple Crown Softball needs volunteers for the concession stand
- Futsol season begins July 8, with ActiveNet registration
- copies of field permits need to be sent to respective schools
- City of San Marcos using a PIN system for insurance filing

Chair Franklin asked staff if field watering will change due to drought restrictions being lifted. Martin replied that most multipurpose fields are closed for rest & renovation through July 31, new sod at Walnut Grove Park is taking very well; new mower and well water use has the fields looking very nice. Bradley Park turf replacement and grading will begin after the Triple Crown tournament.

7. Trail Advisory Committee: June 1, 2016 meeting notes**NOTE & FILE**

Trailblazing and off-trail biking around La Moree has increased ranger patrol near and around Jack's Pond Park. Chair Franklin reminded the trails map planning committee to be mindful of colorblindness; try to avoid using green and red on trail maps. City communications office will be handling web and print updates on trails and large scale distribution.

STAFF COMMENTARY

Buck Martin updated commissioners:

- Discovery Lake spot fire seemed to be caused by someone smoking near Trail 4A. The Fire Marshall and Public Works staff assessed the damage which was not very serious, but the abandoned truck chassis will be removed and clean up is planned for next week.
- Basketball courts at San Elijo middle school will be accessible to the public; beginning June 22, rangers and gym staff will coordinate opening the gate Mon- Sun. from 10am to 8pm for summer hours. The school district will become more involved with the gate opening and closures when school starts again in late August.
- PAWS Event for the Friends of San Marcos is scheduled at Walnut Grove Park, 6/18-19. With over 100 vendors, dock-diving, lure course, and other dog-friendly activities planned, all families are welcome.

**STAFF COMMENTARY, cont.**

- Community Services is trying to strengthen their relationship with TOVEA (Twin Oaks Valley Equestrian Association) and Vallecitos Spurs (VSPURS) about the horse arena usage and schedule, with the eventual goal of managing/prepping the arena for events and improvements. Insurance liability prevents and/or limits volunteer participation without proper insurance coverage. The City will be more involved with the maintenance of the arena and is meeting with park operations next Thursday to learn what is needed for preparation of equestrian events.
- Lining of six pickle-ball courts were added at Woodland Park tennis courts; a schedule is being coordinated for public access and school use. There is discussion of a two day tournament for this summer. The communications office will issue a press release as details are finalized.
- Martin complimented staff Brenda and Ron at their efforts to resolve community complaints about the small wildlife at Woodland Park pond. People have witnessed children harassing ducklings, getting caught in the street, and pulling turtles from the pond. Rangers and Sheriff's officers presence has been increased, but now community volunteers will monitor the area on a regular basis. Commissioner Mockus recommended having a "Duck Day" informational presentation to inform the public of this issue.
- Community Services Budget of \$69 million was approved yesterday by City Council.
- RAA Preschool Spring graduation is scheduled for next week; the Summer session begins June 27. Adventure camp also starting, with a location added at the Community Services building.
- Kiwanis Club retired 400 American Flags at Walnut Grove park using three fire-rings on Flag Day, June 14.
- Four contractors submitted to the open bid for Trails Master Plan update and a decision will occur soon to finalize the contract by June 30.
- San Elijo Hills- HomeFed Development is the title sponsor of the Double Peak Challenge (DPC). In addition to the 10K and fun-run, a health and wellness expo, beer garden, music, and food are being planned. The event will occur Oct. 1, video shown.
- Richmar Park groundbreaking ceremony was June 7, and is scheduled for completion Fall 2016
- Bradley Park is having artificial turf replacement and field grading of the upper softball fields.
- Summer Music Festival had over 500 tickets sold, seven breweries were present. Funds raised from the beer garden benefitted Friends of San Marcos Parks & Recreation. Photos shown.

ORAL COMMUNICATIONS:

Commissioner Sensmeier: July 4 Fireworks fundraiser has over \$8,000 donated, and about \$4,500 in pledges; Fireworks committee meeting scheduled on Monday, June 20. Online campaign has raised over \$1,000 to date.

Commissioner Mockus: Splash pads are now turned back on, hours from 10am-6pm through September 30.

Commissioner Smith: Mountain lions have been sighted in the area, CSUSM notifications are available.

Commissioner Maas: Complimented the Fire Department's response to the Discovery Lake fire and removing the truck chassis. Maas has been sharing DPC information in the community and on social media, and is researching possible sponsorship opportunities. Easements are being reviewed for the San Elijo request of the skate park; needs to be identified: funding sources, public outreach plans, and maintenance costs. SE Hills Foundation might be interested in fundraising for this project.



ORAL COMMUNICATIONS, cont.

Commissioner Towsley: Complimented staff for work on coordinating the Summer Music Festival. She noticed audience and vendor participation was great, and the addition to the family play area was popular. Security and fencing provided a safe and comfortable environment for families; it was truly an enjoyable day at the park.

Commissioner Lindsay: Thanked Chairman Franklin for covering his notes and questions from last month's meeting. Telescope at Double Peak Park was damaged, staff working on getting parts and repair completed. He's wondering if the Clerk's office could add the TAC and YSC to the City calendar.

Chair Franklin: Noted it is an honor and privilege to work with such an active and involved commission; he deeply appreciates everyone's volunteerism and participation, including the Richmar Park groundbreaking ceremony.
