## > fire safety tips to remember

- > Post visible address marker on a contrasting background
- > Create 100-150 feet of defensible space
- > Clear combustible material from under deck and home
- > Keep roof, eaves, and attic vents clean of debris, dead leaves, and pine needles
- > Trim trees and shrubs away from buildings and provide a 10-foot clearance around chimneys
- > Keep tree branches limbed six feet above ground
- > Keep roads and driveways clear of overhead trees and overgrown brush and grass to maintain evacuation routes and access for fire apparatus
- > Keep property free of accumulated combustibles such as dried vegetation, cuttings, wood piles, and combustible material
- > Keep firewood 30 feet from structure
- > Maintain clearance of 10 feet around propane tank
- > Maintaining your home and property is a homeowner's responsibility
