

REPORTS AND OTHER BUSINESS

4. Annual Staff Report, Program Manager Andrea Gonzalez

Program Manager Andrea Gonzalez presented the 2018 year in review to the Parks & Recreation Commission. She reported on items including completed projects, new programs, projects in

progress and upcoming projects for the Parks & Recreation Department. Completed projects include The Democracy in Action project, rebranding of the 4th of July event, the implementation of the new Commercial Use Policy and installation of the Mark J. Noy Jr. Fitness Zone. The Senior Activity Center also received an upgraded A/V with WIFI and sound system.

New programs the Parks & Recreation Department implemented in 2018 include pickle ball lessons at Corky Smith Gym, Dessert & Democracy at the Senior Activity Center, Catch a Ride transportation program and scholarship opportunities for school field trips to Jack's Pond. In progress are scholarship programs for recreation classes, adoption of a No Smoking in Parks Ordinance, a sound system upgrade at Corky Smith Gym, re-evaluation of the special event permit process, implementing the first annual corn hole tournament at Hollandia Park on May 4, 2019, Youth Commission program revamp and Trails Master Plan update. Projects coming soon include the installation of new flooring at the Senior Activity Center Discovery Café, a social media campaign "Game On!" for Parks & Rec. month in July and the CAPRA accreditation outline.

Commissioners Q & A:

Commissioner Mockus complimented staff on the new Mark J. Noy Jr. Fitness Zone. Chair Franklin thanked Andrea for her presentation and requested to see photos of the Fitness Activity Zone, which will be shown at next month's meeting.

5. Annual Youth Sports Group Presentation – San Marcos Youth Soccer

Michael Snow, President of San Marcos Youth Soccer reported on the current Board of Directors, the Mission and Vision of San Marcos Youth Soccer and the different programs offered. He also reported on contributions SMYS has given back to the community as well as scholarships available to players in need. SMYS has seen a 9% growth from 2017 to 2018 and a 43% growth over 8 seasons. San Marcos Revolution will hold its first-ever competitive tournament in August, which is estimated to bring over 1,000 consumers to San Marcos that weekend.

Chair Franklin thanked Michael Snow for his presentation, for continuing to offer a great sports organization to our youth and for bringing a new tournament to our City.

6. Smoking Ordinance – VOTE

Director Buck Martin addressed the Parks & Recreation Commission with the request to approve recommendation to City Council supporting removal of designated smoking areas in parks and facilities and prohibition of smoking in parks.

Commissioner Mockus shared her excitement and commended City staff for their enforcement efforts by giving out warnings over the last six months.

She suggested including in the report or in the recommendation to City Council the Live Well Partnership.

Commissioner Sensmeier asked what the statistics of enforcement is and the impact with other local cities that prohibit smoking in their parks.

Director Buck Martin will get back to the Commission with that information.

Chair Franklin suggested using semi permanent decals that can be put on asphalt or sidewalks at main entrances that say "No Smoking" to limit sign pollution.

Director Buck Martin stated that a marketing campaign is planned to get the word out.

MOVED BY COMMISSIONER MOCKUS, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER SENSMEIER TO RECOMMEND TO CITY COUNCIL TO REMOVE DESIGNATED SMOKING AREAS IN PARKS AND PROHIBIT SMOKING IN PARKS. COMMISSIONERS VOTED UNANIMOUSLY.

9. Special Events List & Social Media Stats -

Commissioner Mockus requested to see the estimated attendance as part of the special event list. Staff will include it in future reports.

Commissioner Sensmeier asked if the open Parks & Recreation Commission seats have been filled. Director Buck Martin said new commissioners will be appointed on January 22, 2019.

Commissioner Smith attended the Christmas event at the Senior Activity Center and said it was enjoyable and there was good attendance.

Commissioner Sensmeier also attended the event and helped serve lunch. She commended Andrea Gonzalez and staff for a doing a great job of putting this event together.

Chair Franklin wished everyone a Happy New Year and thanked staff and fellow Commissioners for attending the meeting.

Chair Franklin thanked Lori and Sean for being San Marcos "Pinterest Rock Stars" for our preschool children.

Buck Martin recognized Eileen McCoy who was a volunteer ranger from 2008 to 2018, supporting several parks. She was a passionate and dedicated volunteer who passed away on January 9, 2019 and she will be missed.

Chair Franklin asked staff to convey and share the commissions' condolences to her friends and family.

REPORTS AND OTHER BUSINESS

5. 2019 Fireworks Fundraising Campaign

Program Manager Holly Malan reminded commissioners that the Fourth of July Fireworks Fundraising Committee will start at the end of March and their assistance is again welcomed. Tuesdays were said to be the best day and Holly will be back in touch with suggested meeting dates.

6. Annual Youth Sports Group Presentation – San Marcos Rugby

San Marcos Rugby coach Uale Taotafa reported on the 2018 participation statistics. There were 60 players this year with 40 boys and 20 girls. Rugby is the fastest growing sport in America. Mr. Taotafa also reported successes on and off the field, and the positive impact the program has on students.

Chair Franklin thanked Uale Taotafa for the information presented and for everything SM Rugby does for San Marcos youth.

NFL Flag Football – Staff will reach out to NFL Flag Football representatives to reschedule.

7. Annual Staff Report, Recreation Supervisor II Cheryl Salazar & Head Lifeguard Rachael Nosewicz - PPT

Head Lifeguard Rachael Nosewicz updated the commissioners on the aquatics program. She reported on program classes, rentals, annual attendance and revenue. Her report included challenges with aging facilities, limited amenities and a shrinking candidate interest. She also reported program successes with increased promotion of water safety and drowning prevention efforts, additional programming and renovated restrooms.

Commissioner Mockus suggested investigating offering course credit or internship for high school and college students to help candidate shortage.

Commissioners Lindsay and Robles requested staff to explore opportunities for lower income patrons.

Director Buck Martin shared with the Commission that the Friends of San Marcos will be donating \$3,000 in scholarships to help lower income patrons. The Scholarship Program will begin on July 1, 2019.

Recreation Supervisor II Cheryl Salazar provided an annual report on department marketing, special events web page redesign, new social media calendar, interactive social media campaigns, and upcoming marketing campaigns and rebranding for City special events.

8. Youth Sports Council meeting, February 5, 2019

Commissioner Smith attended the Youth Sports Council meeting on February 5, 2019 and shared additional notes discussed at the meeting. Sports groups must have at least 70% San Marcos resident participation in order to have field use allocated to them.

Also reported, Las Posas Park does not have "No Dogs Allowed", signs posted near the fields. Director Buck Martin said there are standard signs at all parks that lists park rules. The Department is currently in the process of updating park signage and he will evaluate the signage at Las Posas.

9. Trails Advisory Committee meeting, February 6, 2019

Commissioner Sensmeier attended the Trails Advisory Committee meeting and noted from the meeting that there has been an increase of off trail bike usage and they are looking for solutions.

10. Trails Advisory Committee

Chair Franklin opened a dialogue with fellow commissioners to discuss the future of the Trails Advisory Committee meetings. Recently, there has been a downward trend in actionable items. He asked for Commissioner input and if the frequency of the meetings should be reduced.

Commissioners agreed that the meetings are valuable, and informative to the community and wouldn't want the meetings to cease completely.

Senior Management Analyst Darren Chamow will talk to current members of the committee for their input on meeting quarterly.

11. No Smoking in Parks Ordinance Update

Senior Management Analyst Darren Chamow reported that the no smoking ordinance will be going to Council for a second reading next Tuesday and will be finalized on March 12, 2019. Public Works will be removing and changing park signage. Park Rangers will be trained and begin an education campaign. The office of Communications is working on social media campaigns and press releases to inform the public.

Commissioner Robles asked if the signs will be universal with no smoking and vaping visuals. Commissioner Mockus requested staff to include the universal no vaping visual to the signs as well. Darren will check with Public Works and get back to Commission.

12. Special Events List & Social Media Stats -

No comments or questions.

13. Best of Online photo contest voting

Program Manager Holly Malan explained the process of the online photo contest to the commissioners. The contest runs through February 24, 2019.

Voting will begin next Monday. Commissioners interested in voting will have a chance to vote for their top 3 choices via email. Votes will be accepted through February 27, 2019 and results will be presented at the March meeting.

14. Mark J. Noy Jr. Adult Fitness Zone.

Program Manager Andrea Gonzalez presented slides showing progressive construction photos of the Mark J. Noy Jr. Adult Fitness Zone. The grand opening was cancelled due to rain and is rescheduled for March.

ORAL COMMUNICATIONS

Parks & Recreation Director Buck Martin provided an update on the following items:

- Friends of San Marcos recently funded the Nature Center School Field Trip entrance fees for Title 1 schools to visit Jack's Pond.
- Corn Hole Tournament coming May 4 2019. There will be music, food trucks and activities for kids.
- Youth Commission by laws will be updated and will go to Council in April.
- Partnership with City of Encinitas to provide a higher quality food service to our seniors. Grant challenges have extended our current grant until June 30, 2019.
- Trails Master Plan will be presented to Parks & Recreation Commission in April and then sent to Planning Commission and to City Council for final approval.
- The Department is working with Public Safety and Public Works to increase our video surveillance camera program within the city.

COMMISSIONER COMMENTARY

Commissioner Smith thanked everyone for presenting today and for providing detailed information.

Commissioner Robles said she was happy to be on board and looks forward to her time as a Parks & Recreation Commissioner.

Commissioner Mockus and Lindsay welcomed new commissioners Letty Robles and Judy Prestininzi.

I understand that there are a few big problems with that area, I know that the jumps are a huge liability to the city, and that there are other things that area is used for that are not beneficial to the community, as well as people leaving their trash there and not treating the area with respect, but I believe there are solutions to these problems other than getting rid of the jumps.

The liability issue I believe is the most prominent and most difficult to find a solution for, however I have two ideas that might work and I would love to hear any feedback or possibly other methods that would lessen the risk of the city. The first idea being that we set up some kind of waiver system, where we get signatures from kids parents or adults wanting to ride at the jumps. I have discussed this option with my peers I ride with and they all have enthusiastically expressed their willingness to enforce this system to any new riders they see in order to keep the city out of risk. My other idea was to treat the jumps almost like a skatepark. I am not entirely sure as to how the legal side of skateparks work, but from my research it seems as long as we keep the jumps in a safe ride-able condition, make sure people are not endangering others with their riding, and there are posted signs to ride at one's own risk, this may decrease the chance of somebody suing. Those are my ideas on removing the threat of liability on the cities part, and if those ideas can be improved or better steps can be taken, I am open to doing anything within my power to keep the jumps there.

Another prominent issue is the fact that underage people use that area to smoke pot and drink alcohol, and create an unsafe or unpleasant environment for people living around the area and using the adjacent trails. This is an extremely unfortunate truth about the location, but behavior my friends and fellow riders do not support or permit their. Whenever we suspicious people we try to give them the benefit of the doubt, but if we suspect that they are going to smoke or drink, we tell them off and have made people leave before they are able to start doing these things that put us riders in a bad light. We are hoping the huge increase of traffic in that area and presence of younger kids will ultimately discourage any of that activity in the future of that spot. We have also done what I believe to be a good thing by picking up any and all trash we find back in the area, and have instituted a rule that everyone who goes back there must take 3 pieces of trash with them when they leave. This is unfortunately very easy to do, and many of us have been taking full bags of trash out with us because of all the trash we have found while digging.

In the long run I feel as though leaving the trails there to be ridden will only benefit the community in the long run. In the most recent weeks that I have been digging and riding there, I have seen how much a place like that can bring all sorts of people together. From the people in their early thirties and fourties, who have offered to help build or film us riding and take professional pictures, to kids not older than ten years old like my older brother who have finally found something they find fun enough to get them outside and off the television, and everyone in between, the jumps just get people excited. I ask that instead of removing the jumps, we look at other ways to solve the issues at hand and heighten the quality of life even more in our city. Thank you very much for your time, and I really do hope we can find a solution to this that benefits all parties.
