ORAL COMMUNICATIONS

Volunteer Recognition Awards –Lori Dwyer, Recreation Leader presented an award and recognized Debbie Brittsan who works at Home Depot and coordinates the art and craft project for Home Depot. Debbie has been collecting and saving products from every department in the store and donating them to the City Adventure Day Camp program. Debbie has donated over 60 kits to make various projects such as bird houses that the kids look forward to every year. She also donates aprons that the kids are able to take home with their project. Lori thanked Debbie and the staff at Home Depot for their generous support to the Adventure Day Camp program over the past 20 years.

Chair Franklin asked staff to send a thank you letter to Home Depot and Debbie.

REPORTS AND OTHER BUSINESS

4. Annual Youth Sports Group Presentation, San Marcos Girls Softball

San Marcos Girls Softball past president Tina Sybesma and current president Buzz Byer reported the organization had 457 girls last year and this year they have 420 girls registered. The organization continues to attend a Padre game at Petco Park, hold a golf fundraiser at St. Marks, and host softball tournaments to generate revenue for the organization. Buzz noted he is looking forward to raising the participants so the girls can continue to having fun on the field.

Commissioner Robles asked if they provide any scholarships for the enrollees. Tina noted they do have funds set aside for scholarships and this year Allen Brothers was a big sponsor. The organization also donates a free registration to Richland Elementary and to SM Youth Baseball.

5. Annual Staff Report, Community Center Administration, Enrichment Programs, Facility Reservations

Recreation Supervisor Holly Payad reported on the administration of the Community Center including the hours and staffing structure. Holly reported she has 30 contractors going into the fall season. New classes include children acting, ballet folklórico, cardio tennis and royal academy of dance which is a prestigious program and has not been offered at a recreation center before in San Diego County. Challenges include adult programming classes declining in enrollment which is being seen county-wide. Another challenge is with decreased enrollment in summer enrichment camps due to other entities like the school district offering comparable camps at many schools in San Marcos taught by teachers. Holly noted the successes include the refund policy, trail classes, insurance coverage for instructors, and transitioning sports classes under the athletic department. The Tree Lighting will be held on Saturday, December 7th from 1-7pm. The breakfast with santa will be held on the following Saturday.

Krystal Mainprize, Community Services Specialist reported on indoor facility reservations and outdoor shelter reservations. The City has 5 recreations centers for the public to rent 11 different rooms. The Facility Reservation Policy was updated and went into effect on July 1, 2019. The City has 25 reservable park shelters and some allow jump horses, ponies and petting zoos.

6. Trails Advisory Committee – Options Discussion

Program Manager Darren Chamow reviewed the options for the Trails Advisory Committee (TAC) included in the Commission packet. The guidelines have not been updated since 2008 so they are well out of date. Darren asked Commissioners to decide what they feel is the best option.

Chair Franklin feels it is best to get input from the TAC members. He would like to hold another meeting with them to get their input.

Commissioner Sensmeier noted the trails are a very important resource for the City and the green space is a positive attribute for the citizens to recreate. She doesn't want anything to jeopardize that.

Commissioner Lindsay was a member of the TAC during the end of the growth expansion and feels it is important for form a subcommittee to meet with the members to get their input and revive the committee.

Commissioners want to form a subcommittee with commissioners, staff and TAC members. They would like to meet before September 11th.

7. Special Events List and Social Media Posts

Chair Franklin asked for Robin Rockey to come to the meeting so they can meet her.

Commissioner Lindsay noted Double Peak Challenge event was not listed on the special event list. Darren Chamow noted it was submitted so it will be included on next month's list.

ORAL COMMUNICATIONS

Parks & Recreation Director Buck Martin provided an update on the following items:

- Introduced Evan Hoenig who is the management analyst for the department.
- The Commission Parks and Recreation email is now updated.
- A recommendation is being made to the City Manager to make an ordinance for catch and release at Discovery Lake. People are fishing and taking buckets of fish out of the lake and they are fishing out all the bass. We are having issues with fishing line and hooks affecting the wildlife at the lake.
- Public Works is also purchasing an aeration system for the lake to improve the lake quality and take care of the algae bloom.
- Woodland Park Pool does not have adequate lighting to have nighttime programming. The School District wanted to use the pool in the evening for the swim team. A study was done and to properly light the pool it would cost \$300,000 to adequately light the pool.
- 8 acres at Bradley Park will be used for a mountain bike course using prop 68 per capita funding. San Diego Mountain Biking Association donated \$2,000 and Friends of San Marcos donated \$4,500 to get the design element completed.
- The Friends of San Marcos provided funding for Title 1 Schools in San Marcos to attend a field trip at Jack's Pond Nature Center. They have donated that again this year. New this year, Vallecitos Water District is funding the transportation to and from the field trips for all the Title I schools.
- The City has submitted for Prop 68 funding which is \$5.5 million dollar ask. It will be used to build an inclusionary playground, a 2-5/5-12 playground and dog park at Bradley Park.
- This past weekend San Marcos Youth Soccer held a large tournament with over 150 teams.

COMMISSIONER COMMENTARY

Commissioner Robles asked what grades benefit from the Jack's Pond Field Trip. Darren Chamow answered grades 1st – 4th can attend and the grant is just for the San Marcos Title 1 Schools.

Commissioner Lindsay remembers a presentation from an out of town citizen about not recommending catch and release and Ranger Staff agreed with that protocol. Director Martin will look into this and get back with the Commission.

Chair Franklin attended some of the community meetings for the \$5.5 million grant and appreciates staffs work on looking for additional funding sources for our amazing City.

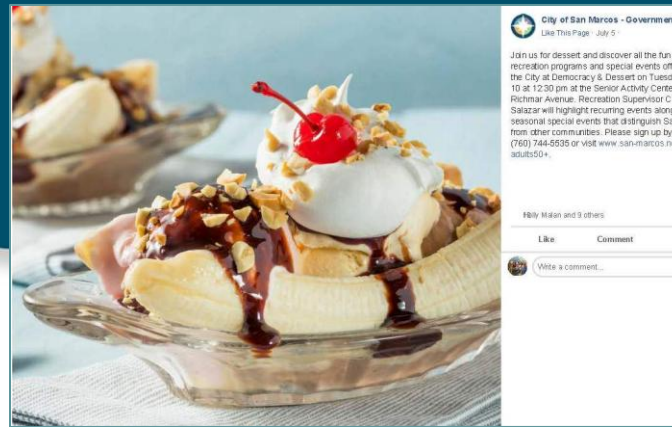

Call to order

James Daza called the Youth Sports Council meeting to order at 6:03pm.

Approval of Minutes

Kelly Breihan (San Marcos Youth Lacrosse) motioned to approve the minutes from the June 4, 2019 meeting. Doug Scharin (San Elijo AYSO 1505) seconded the motion.

Motion carried 6-0.

San Marcos Unified School District Update

James reminded all YSC members that all permits for San Marcos Unified School District fields are now going through the Facilitron reservation software. James reminded all members that they will not be charged for School District field usage and San Marcos Unified School District was still working out some bugs in the system when YSC members were submitting their permit requests.

Sport Field Updates

Sports fields update was given by Art Sotelo.

After current assessments, all sports fields are currently in good condition.

Art mentioned that Bradley Park Multipurpose field 1 is showing some wear down the middle of the field and urged YSC members to remind coaches to rotate drills to minimize field



damage. The Bradley Park Soccer Arena shade sail project is waiting on the structure to be re-engineered before it is installed again.

Art informed the YSC that Walnut Grove Park and San Elijo Upper fields have new “Smart” irrigation controllers. He reminded YSC representatives to notify City staffs if they notice fields are being overwatered creating wet conditions when they are at facilities. Playing on wet fields will cause significant damage to the turf. Art informed the YSC that from September 9-September 18 the City has been notified to limit field irrigation because the San Diego County Water Authority will be replacing a large water pipe that supplies most of San Diego County with water.

Art notified San Marcos Youth Baseball that Mission Sports Park will be re-lamped over the next few weeks. The project should not affect evening practices and games with the work taking place during the day.

Doug Scharin (AYSO 1505) requested the use of San Elijo Lower in the future due to the poor conditions at San Elijo Middle School fields. He stated that the field is not suitable for their games and they are receiving complaints from participants. James and Art stated that they can look at using San Elijo Lower softball field in the future but need to work out logistics regarding temporary field lining for their games to limit coaches from using the same areas for practices during the week.

Tegriscap

James and Art informed the YSC members that the Tegriscap fees for extra janitorial service during tournaments and special events will be increasing. Their contract is expiring so the job is going out to bid and with new State regulations the new cost will likely be increasing due to prevailing wages. Art stated that they do not know the exact cost and won't have that information until after the contract has been awarded.

James requested that the second visits that Tegriscap make to some of the sports parks continue through the weekend of November 22-23 like they have in previous years. Art asked James to work with Stew Rutledge and Amanda Haas to coordinate extending the second park visits.



Field Allocation / Soccer Updates

James reminded all soccer organization presidents that he needs their practice field matrix showing how many teams they have practicing at their allocated fields to ensure the field usage is being maximized for all organizations.

Lori stated that the soccer organizations are trying to work out a plan to move one smaller set of goals from San Elijo Hilltop to Hollandia Park Multipurpose field. She asked if any other organizations would be able to help moving the goals; James Morales (AYSO 127) stated that he might be able to help with the move.

James informed the YSC that the inaugural Revolution Cup, hosted by San Marcos Youth Soccer, had 136 teams and overall the tournament ran smooth. He reminded all YSC organizations that going forward they must have a league representative as the point of contact for all communication between them and the City for their requests.

James reminded all YSC organizations to return any unused field space so other organizations in need of extra space have the option to use it. James reminded all organizations to report any unauthorized practices being held throughout the City. He reminded all organizations if they come into contact with any other flag football groups to take a picture of the practice and send it to him so he can follow up with NFL Flag football or Friday Night Lights representatives.

Connors Park

James reminded the YSC members that San Marcos Pop Warner returned Mondays and Fridays at Connors Park. This made it possible to allocate this field space to San Marcos Youth Soccer on Monday's and NFL Flag Football on Fridays.

James reminded the YSC members who have access to the Connors Park storage room that the room needs to be organized. He will send a follow up email to the organizations next week to come up with a plan to organize the room.

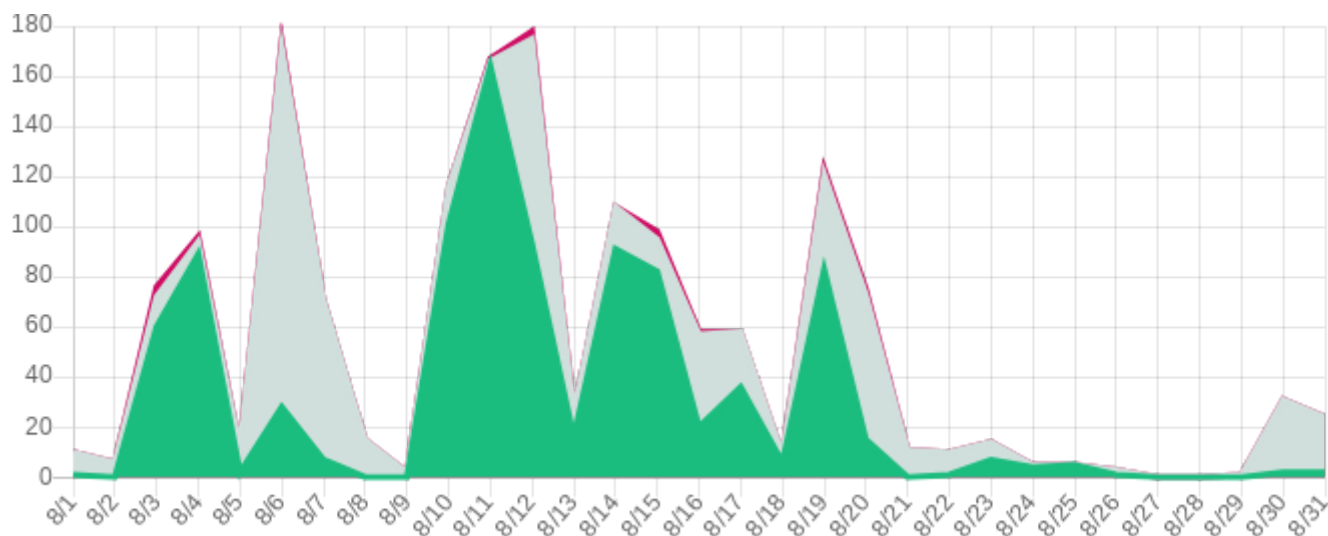

At the August meeting, Commissioner Lindsay asked staff to research how the Department of Fish and Wildlife (DFW) felt about a catch and release process at Lakeview Park. This is something that was supposedly researched in the past by staff. Below is the correspondence staff had with the DFW regarding the pros and cons of converting the lake to a catch and release body of water.

This issue was discussed at the September 11th TAC meeting as well. Staff will provide a quick summary of this discussion at the September commission meeting.

Hello All,

I just got a call back from Matt Lucero. He was not familiar with any study done by DFW at Discovery Lake in the past 10 years and wasn't able to comment on why DFW didn't support mandatory catch & release in the past. He is not familiar with Discovery Lake or any issues at the location but gave his opinion on some similar locations with similar issues. Here is a list of his comments:

- Catch & release only lakes generally stunt the growth of larger game fish like bass and end up creating a larger population of smaller bass instead of large bass due to more fish competing for the same food supply.
- He recommended introducing more bass to the lake may be a good idea if the municipal code is changed to help regrow the species if there is not currently a steady population of bass in the lake. (A full study on the balance of Discovery Lake would be recommended before stocking additional fish.)
- If we continue to have issues with poaching/taking large amounts of fish, he could send a DFW game warden out to issue state citations.
