REPORTS AND OTHER BUSINESS

4. Discovery Lake Environmental Report from Storm Water

Reed Thornberry, Storm Water Program Manager reported to the Commission on the water quality and esthetics of Discovery Lake. Reed gave commissioners the background on the man-made lake that was formed in the 1950's. Improvements to the lake occurred in the early 1990's and the City took ownership of the water rights at that time. In 1992 the first set of actual construction plans were made.

In the mid 2000's water quality impairments were encountered as the water was very shallow with the deepest part being 8 feet but most areas are around 5 feet deep. The lake had lots of algae growth and extra nutrient contributions. The lake didn't have enough oxygen and was smelly and green tinted. The City dredged the lake, continued to use lake pesticides, water quality and soil testing continued.

The City recently brought on an engineering company to do a study of the lake. The City received the report in the spring of 2019. Reed gave Commissioners a portion of the report which reviewed the top three strategies to improve the lake quality. The top strategy was an ozone based aeration treatment which is a newer technology. Reed explained that this technology does work best in deeper water however the ozone will still break down the algae and oils in the water and aeration helps to move the water and distribute the oxygen.

The City is looking to install a pilot ozone unit at the lake to see its effects and then proceed with a full scale version if it improves the lake quality.

Chair Franklin thanked Reed for his report.

Commissioners had questions about the lake, the sensitive habitat and the pilot program. Reed was able to answer their questions. The commissioners requested the full report be emailed to them and an update in three months and Reed obliged. Commissioners want to make sure the public is notified of this pilot program to help frontload any of their questions or concerns.

5. Annual Staff Report, Youth Programs and Nature Center

Recreation Supervisor, Jennifer Overman was present tonight to give her annual staff report on youth programming. She introduced Amber Schmaltz and Kimberly Valdovinos who reported on two different youth programs.

Amber Schmaltz, Recreation Leader reported on the Raggedy Ann and Andy Preschoolers program which has run for over 35 years with over 400 children actively enrolled. A new system is being implemented to limit single use products and cut down on waste where each child brings a reusable water bottle to school each day.

The Adventure Day Camp program is for school aged children over the summer and breaks when school is not in session. They keep the children busy by doing fun projects and crafts mainly used from recycled materials. The kids go on a field trip once a week including laser tag, bowling and trips to the pool.

Kimberly Valdovinos, Recreation Coordinator, presented on the Jack's Pond Nature Center field trips and events. The Nature Center is open on the weekends from 10am – 1pm and does rely on the support of volunteers. Kimberly is in the process of remodeling all ten rooms and they have already completed the nocturnal animal room. Each room is being repainted and updated with new manipulatives and hands on activities to engage the children.

Kimberly has applied for a grant through the Community Foundation for \$4,800 to purchase supplies and items for the other eight rooms in the Nature Center.

The nature center field trips include San Marcos schools as well as surrounding City schools. The cost is \$4 per student. The Friends of San Marcos Parks and Recreation provided money to fund 60 children from each Title 1 school in San Marcos to attend a field trip. This year Vallecitos Water District has contributed by paying for the busing cost to get the children to and from the Nature Center.

Junior Ranger Day was a successful event and had a larger turnout than previous years. They had hands on activities for the children, animal experiences including snakes and a horse, and other vendors with items for each family to take home with them.

Commissioner Robles does agree that this park is a hidden gem and would really benefit from promotion because not many people know the park is there. Robles also noted that personally reaching out to each Title 1 School to market the field trip program would be a huge benefit.

Jennifer Overman, Recreation Supervisor spoke to the Commission about recent and upcoming events. The recently held Pumpkin Breakfast was a fun inexpensive family event with fun activities and games for the children to play and receive prizes. The Tree Lighting Event is coming up the first weekend in December while the Breakfast with Santa will happen the 2nd Saturday in December and includes a picture with Santa.

The annual Family Campout includes crafts, s'mores, campfire songs, watching a movie and other fun activities.

- He thanked commissioners for volunteering in the City booth at the Chamber of Commerce street fair.
- He reminded Commissioners Lindsay and Smith that they need to reapply to keep their seat on the Commission.
- The School District and the City worked together to maximize the availability of the tennis courts during the day. A schedule has been created to allow the community more access.

- The City applied for a competitive prop 68 grant and Andrea was contacted by the state to schedule a site visit of our location which is great news.
- Palomar College is holding a boo dash this weekend.
- The City Starwalk event is coming up October 20th at Double Peak Park.
- The Family Night Halloween party will be held at the Wood House this weekend.
- The Veterans Day Event will be held on November 11th at Helen Bouger Park.
- A craft fair and car show will be held in November at the Senior Activity Center.
- Staff is working on the updated statistic reporting and will be presenting it to the Commission soon.

COMMISSIONER COMMENTARY

Commissioner Robles received a comment from a community member who did not feel it was appropriate for the Double Peak Challenge to include a beer garden at a school promoted event/fundraiser.

Commissioner Mockus suggests moving the City booth at the street fair events to the other side of the street so the sun doesn't shine straight into the booth.

Commissioner Smith noted the turnout seemed larger this year at the street fair.

Chair Franklin hopes Parks and Recreation can get a better location for our table because the coyote was tucked in the corner. Franklin enjoyed competing in the Double Peak Challenge and is glad the weather was cooler.






