ORAL COMMUNICATIONS

Director Buck Martin thanked Commissioner Smith and Lindsay for applying to be on the Commission again.

CONSENT CALENDAR

Chair Franklin asked what the marketing for the catch a ride program consisted of. Andrea Gonzalez noted they worked with the communications department to create a tri-fold brochure about the program, a resource fair was held at the Senior Center, news releases were distributed and outreach was conducted at the 55 plus mobile home parks.

COMMISSIONER SMITH MOVED TO APPROVE CONSENT CALENDAR ITEMS 1 AS PRESENTED, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER SENSMEIRER AND CARRIED TO APPROVE. ABSTENTION: COMMISSIONER LINDSAY, MOCKUS, AND PRESTININZI.

COMMISSIONER SMITH MOVED TO APPROVE CONSENT CALENDAR ITEM 2 & 3 AS PRESENTED, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER MOCKUS AND CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY TO APPROVE.

REPORTS AND OTHER BUSINESS

Chair Franklin noted at last month's meeting the Commission discussed and agreed on the recommendation by the City Council to name the gymnasium after Mayor Corky Smith and name an urban trail segment along the south side of Barham Drive from Twin Oaks Valley Road to Campus Way after Mayor Lee Thibadeau. This item was not formally voted on and agendized so Franklin asked to follow the proper protocol and place it on the agenda.

MOVED BY COMMISSIONER SENSMEIRER, SECOND BY COMMISSIONER HERNANDEZ AND CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY TO ADD THE RESOULUTION FOR NAMING THE SAN MARCOS GYMNASIUM FACILITY AND A TRAIL SEGMENT ON BARHAM DRIVE AFTER FORMER MAYORS ON THE AGENDA.

Chair Franklin read the naming resolution to the Commission.

MOVED BY COMMISSIONER MOCKUS, SECOND BY COMMISSIONER SMITH AND CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY TO MOVE THE RESOULUTON AS PRESENTED TO THE CITY COUNCIL.

4. Annual Report, San Marcos Youth Soccer

Michael Snow, President of San Marcos Youth Soccer (SMYS) presented to the Commission. Michael reviewed the 2019 board members all who are working for the betterment of the youth in San Marcos. SMYS was incorporated in 2011 and has always promoted good well being for the youth. The organization tries to keep the cost low for its participants and holds true to their mission, vision and values. The organization has a rec program, a competitive program called Revolution and a special needs program for all ages called Tops. Over their nine season tenure they have grown by 39%. SMYS provides scholarships and also give back to the community by supporting other nonprofit organizations.

Michael noted all volunteers are required to have a background check and take a 2 ½ hour online "safe sport" class which the league covers for all volunteers.

SMYS could not run the program without the help of the City and they appreciate the fantastic support system.

Chair Franklin thanked Michael for all he does for the San Marcos youth.

Commissioner Hernandez asked how new regulations will affect costs for the league. Michael noted the participant fees will go up. The cost for the online safety class is \$35 per year per volunteer. The cost for the federal life scan with the Department of Justice is an additional \$17 per volunteer.

5. Annual Report, Year End Wrap Up

Andrea Gonzalez, Program Manager presented a report on the Department year in review. Andrea reviewed the department accomplishments, including completed projects such as adoption of no smoking in City parks, a sound system upgrade at the gymnasium, launch of a new special event permit process, re-organization of employee responsibilities allowing for internal staff promotions and growth, San Marcos 360 Recreation Guide redesign, installation of new flooring at the Senior

Activity Center, implementation of a new indoor rental facility policy and fee structure, and grant funds for the Senior Nutrition Program through 2025 through the San Diego Aging & Independent Services.

New programs and events included the first annual Bags N' Brews cornhole tournament, a partnership with SER to use paid volunteers in staff roles at the Senior Activity Center, establishment of a swim for fitness program at Las Posas Pool, establishment of a scholarship program for recreation classes, expansion of the Fun Friday Nites program to accommodate an additional 10 kids at each location, and new enrichment class offerings including Hula and Royal Academy of Dance.

Projects in progress include development and implementation of a centralized department training program, trails master plan update, website re-organization, youth commission program revamp, revamp of the outdoor facility rental and park permit reservation program, department-wide sustainability plan, five-year department strategic plan development, Democracy in Action project, create a sponsorship/donation policy for increased revenue stream and complete the design and begin construction process for a mountain bike park and pump track at Bradley Park.

Commissioners asked for the PowerPoint to be emailed to them and they loved the info graphic in the presentation. They would like to be able to share the info graphic on social media. Andrea noted the Communications Department will be showcasing it in the next week or so. Commissioner Robles noted having the info graphic in Spanish would be ideal. Commissioner Mockus added to that by asking if we have a common languages threshold for the City. She noted the County puts out all there literature in five languages.

Commissioner Mockus asked if we have plans to increase the number of volunteers as a way to get more residents involved with the City. Chair Franklin asked how we manage our volunteers and how can we scale that up as we continue to grow. Director Martin said when we have not had any shortfall on obtaining volunteers for our events as we partner with other community organizations such as the School District.

6. Facility Use Applications- Various Groups

COMMISSIONER SENSMERER MOVED TO APPROVE THE INDOOR FACILITY RENTAL APPLICATIONS AS PRESENTED, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER MOCKUS AND CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY TO APPROVE.

7. Trails Advisory Committee Applications

MOVED BY COMMISSIONER SENSMERER, SECOND BY COMMISSIONER HERNANDEZ AND CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY TO APPOINT DAVID SIMPSON TO THE TRAILS ADVISORY COMMITTEE.

8. Trails Advisory Committee Guidelines

Chair Franklin noted the guidelines were last approved in February of 2008 and in section 3-Appointment does say the committee needs eight members and we are currently at six. Commissioners discussed the appointment section, the alternate position, and quorum.

Commissioners recommend the Commission needs to be a nonvoting member as it is a conflict of interest and suggested having three members be a quorum.

Andrea Gonzalez will send out the guidelines in track changes mode for Commissioner to see and recommend changes by the City Attorney and Committee.

Commissioner Robles requested to send an email about the trails advisory committee to all the hike participants hoping to recruit. Chair Franklin requested to add this into the Senior Newsletter. Robles also mentioned the questions on the application makes it seems like we require lots of experience and we don't want to discourage applicants.

Commissioners want to make changes to the guidelines so they will work with staff to complete a new draft and bring it back at a future meeting.

9. Special Events List and Social Media

Chair Franklin thanked Darren for including the word count.

Chair Franklin asked how the Star Walk events are doing. Darren Chamow noted a year ago when it first started we had 20 people and the last one had about 130 people. The next event will include hot cocoa.

ORAL COMMUNICATIONS

Parks & Recreation Director Buck Martin provided an update on the following items:

- Congratulated Commissioner Lindsay and Smith on their reappointment.
- North County Transit District is in charge of all the shade structures at the bus stops.
- The department has been working with Public Works and Facilities to make some upgrades at the Las Posas Aquatics facility so that will begin soon.
- The Belgium Waffle Ride is listed on the special event list and staff did meet with the group about some of the concerns from last year.
- The Senior Center did get the Nutrition Grant through the County of San Diego and he congratulated Catherine Manis and Brian Thill for all their work on the project.
- The department will be holding a shelter management training on January 22nd conducted by the Red Cross.
- The Youth Commission has updated its bylaws and this will go to the City Council for approval.
- The City recently took over the maintenance of Innovation Park so Public Works made some adjustments and changes and the pickle ball community is very happy.
- There was an AYSO Soccer tournament at Walnut Grove Park this past weekend and people just raved about it. Buck thanked Art Sotelo and his amazing team for their hard work with keeping the park so pristine.

COMMISSIONER COMMENTARY

Commissioner Smith thanked everyone for the participation on the Commission and is happy to be joining them for another few years. Smith would like us to let Public Works know that at Hollandia Park the dog water fountain is not draining properly.

San Marcos Unified School District Update

San Marcos Unified School District update was given by James Daza.

James reminded all YSC members to send all permit requests through Facilitron. He noted that there are some new employees in the School District Offices so there might be a learning curve as they get familiar with their new roles.

Sport Field Updates

Sports fields update was given by Art Sotelo.

All multi-purpose fields have been re-seeded and the seed is growing in nicely. Sod was recently installed at Walnut Grove North and Public Works is planning to install sod this week at Las Posas Park Stadium field in limited areas.



Both softball fields at San Elijo Park will be re-graded and laser leveled this week. Once the infields are leveled, Public Works staff will reset all base pegs, home plates and marking feathers.




