MINUTES

Regular Meeting of the Parks and Recreation Commission

CALL TO ORDER

At 6:01p.m. Parks and Recreation Commission Chair Franklin called the meeting to order.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Chair Franklin led the Pledge of Allegiance.

REPORTS AND OTHER BUSINESS

3. Annual Report

Callum Salter, AYSO 1505 & United General Manager, gave the presentation.

Callum told Commissioners that AYSO truly enables everyone to play and creates an environment where children can flourish and get out on the field. Through the volunteers' efforts of many coaches and referees, the youth have been able to not only learn the fundamentals of soccer but learn social skills and how to be leaders. AYSO started out with 175 players and has now grown to an organization with 1,500 kids and 5 different programs including Jamboree, United and AYSO VIP to meet everyone needs.

Commissioners asked questions and Callum answered them.

Chair Franklin thanked Callum for his report.

AYSO 127

James Morales, Commissioner, and Joanne Shannon, a previous Commissioner, gave the presentation.

James noted AYSO stands for coming together and enjoying playing the sport of soccer. The organization came back in full force for the fall 2021 season after COVID and they do offer scholarships for hardships and also offer a multi child discount. Many parents and grandparents help volunteer and also high school student's volunteer for hours. AYSO offers two tournaments a year at Walnut Grove Park and that brings revenue to the City. Fall season is the core program but they also offer a coed spring season that is more fun and less competitive.

Vice-Chair Lindsay thanked them for the presentation and noted we are aware of the constraints we have with fields and asked how it impacts the program and how they deal with it. James noted that there are constraints but each organization does their part to share fields and make it work. It's difficult because everyone wants their own park and that's just not feasible. The kids are first and that's why everyone cooperates and we all win.

AYSO 1505 representative, spoke up to say she manages the schedules and is very aware of what all the youth programs offer. The field space is rapidly shrinking in San Marcos with the new developments being built, there are massive developments that are attracting families. When it rains there is only two fields available for all of San Marcos. Additional synthetic turf fields are desperately needed as well as natural turf. Issues arise when fields flood; the field could be closed for a week and that really impacts the program. Many of the fields don't have lighting and that's a large loss of use when its fall and gets dark early. Summer rest and renovation is 30-60 days and that dramatically decreases the field spaces available.

Commissioner Mockus-Valenzuela noted coed teams was mentioned and asked how inclusivity and gender fluidity is addressed in the organization. Joanne noted that AYSO has a policy that allows them to play.

Chair Franklin asked staff if there is a report that shows when we are not providing space to the community. Director Martin noted we have a yearly schedule of all the fields and when they will down for rest and renovation. Public Works maintains the fields and they are the experts on the grass and there are reasons why the fields rest in the summer. Martin will ask Public Works manager to come provide a report to the Commission about the field maintenance.

Chair Franklin noted lighting at Walnut Grove Park has come up in the past and asked if any traction has happened. Staff noted that if there is enough demand and buzz anything is possible but it is a hard sell in that community as it is a rural area of San Marcos.

Director Martin noted new fields will be breaking ground in September in the Rancho Tesoro neighborhood and it will be a FIFA sized field and another half field.

4. Sprockids San Diego Commercial Use

Commissioner discussed the use. Commissioners would like to see a quick video on his class in the future.

MOVED BY COMMISSIONER ROBLES, SECOND BY COMMISSIONER SMITH AND CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY TO APPROVE SPROCKIDS SAN DIEGO COMMERCIAL USE REQUEST.

6. Park Naming Policy

Director Martin had a meeting with the City Manager after the last meeting discussion and Mr. Griffin said he is going to work on this with the City Attorney and the City Clerk to update this naming policy.

Chair Franklin is excited to see the draft and thanked staff for updating this 32 year old policy.

Vice-Chair Franklin asked if there is a timeline for this. Director Martin will ask and let the Commission know.

6. Youth Sports Council Meeting Minutes- May 3rd

Commissioner Diaz attended the very efficient meeting and everything was captured in the minutes.

7. Trails Advisory Committee (TAC)

Assistant Director, Andrea Gonzalez noted this item will stay on the agenda until the TAC has a full committee. Andrea noted she had a conversation with Taylor Oshinski for the timing on the social media campaign so that is in the works.

Chair Franklin asked if communications is ready to go, and if they have it in Spanish as well. Andrea noted the social media is ready to go and the flyer is available in Spanish and will check with communication about the social media posts and how that would work.

Chair Franklin asked if the City has Tiktok. Andrea noted we do not. Franklin noted he asks because there is other ways to reach our community members and discord is popular now as well.

Vice-Chair Lindsay asked how many current members we have. Andrea noted we have three current members and there are four open seats available. Lindsay suggested contacting known representatives to see if they could commit to 6 months or a year until we get new recruitments so we can continue meeting.

Commissioner Sensmeier suggested recognizing the TAC in some way as they did an amazing job with the E-Bike proposal that City Council approved. If we recognized the committee it would create some buzz and interest for the committee.

Commissioner Mockus-Valenzuela suggested posting the flyer in the park kiosks.

Commissioners suggested reaching out to the high school clubs as they might be interested and also posting the meeting dates on the flyer, and also sending the flyer in peachjar.

8. Q3 Statistics

Commissioner-Mockus Valenzuela noted the adult classes had an increase and asked if the Senior 50+ are the only classes at the Senior Center and also asked if there is not enough demand or contractors to offer more. Andrea Gonzalez noted with adult classes the gyms are a big competitor of ours as they offer everything in one stop.

Chair Franklin noted the stats got readjusted and wants to see apples to apples with numbers prior to the pandemic. Numbers from 2018 or 2019 would be helpful and want to know if we are growing and leveraging our facilities properly. Andrea noted we can run some reservation reports for the commission to compare.

PARKS AND RECREATION DIRECTOR REPORT

Director Buck Martin informed the Commission on department events and updates.

Martin said invitations went out for the State of Your Community that will be held on June 2nd, the Wags and Water event went well, Bike to Work Day is tomorrow, the Bags and Brews Event was very well attended and sold out and all the cans were recycled.

Las Posas pool programming had to be moved to Woodland Pool as the heater at Las Posas went down. We are having a challenge with chlorine as well.

The Woodland Park pond will be dredged this August as it happens every three years.

A new part time Communications Specialist has been hired, her name is Rania Zigic and she will be attending all the City Ribbon Cuttings and other City events for the elected officials.

The Office of Communications is developing a language access plan. The 4th of July campaign will be rolled out soon as we still need to raise 12k to pay for the fireworks show.

Commissioner Prestininzi asked how the dredging and aeration at Discovery Lake is going. Martin noted that the aeration machine has made a difference in the lake. Martin will ask if Storm Water can provide an update.

Chair Franklin appreciated seeing all the staff at Jack's Pond today and noticed a lack of diversity of membership of staff. Great mix of male and female but with cultural diversity when he sees a lack of representation he always asks the question why they aren't at the table and what are they doing actively to ensure this. Franklin said Director Martin has done an amazing job with allowing team members to grow in new roles and positions and wonders if there is not enough diverse qualified applicants making it to his attention.

Director Martin noted many of our employees have been here ten years plus and noted he can do a breakdown and will work with Human Resources to see what they do for employment applicants.

Chair Franklin noted it wasn't just visual representation but the new staff who came from CSUSM represents the large group of individuals in Parks and Recreation missing diversity and wonders if she came to the City because she sees herself here and others may not see themselves here. Franklin is looking forward to hearing from Human Resources.

ORAL COMMUNICATIONS

Commissioner Diaz visited Sunset Park with his daughter and she had so much fun at the splash pad and noted we are so lucky to have a park like that in San Marcos.

Commissioner Robles would like to forward the State of Your Community invite to some of her Latino Leaders and asked if a Spanish version of the invitation is available and also if an interpreter will be present at the event and if not how can one be requested. Also, the event will be televised and asked if there will be captions in Spanish. Robles also noted the State of the City will be held at CSUSM on June 8th the San Marcos Prevention Collation will be receiving recognition from the San Marcos Chamber of Commerce. Andrea noted that the invitation is being translated now and will be available, the program itself will be in English and Spanish at the event and the interpreter is confirmed for the event and for the televised version should be available in Spanish captions.

Commissioner Mockus-Valenzuela said the Wags and Water event was phenomenal to see that many people out in the park. The water fountains are awesome and much needed for the dogs.

Commissioner Smith enjoyed the Nature Center and meeting with all the staff, and the kids loved it so she will be taking them next Saturday.

Commissioner Sensmeier thanked staff for the dinner and tour.

Commissioner Prestininzi attended the ribbon cutting for Gratitude Trail and that was an emotional day and she also attended Wags and Water and it was a lot of fun.

Chair Franklin thanked staff for the tour of the Nature Center and noted a promatorial model is a community advocate model that is a member of the same culture, uses the same language, and connects with all folks including lay person and most importantly they are trusted member of the community and he thanked everyone for the work that they do.

Call to order

Eric Leichliter called the Youth Sports Council meeting to order at 6:03pm.

Approval of Minutes

Stephanie Walker (San Marcos Youth Baseball) motioned to approve the minutes from the May 3, 2022 meeting. Katie Anderson (San Elijo AYSO 1505) seconded the motion.

Motion carried 7-0.

San Marcos Unified School District Update

Not Present

Eric reminded YSC members that school district fields are closed during their summer break.

Sport Field Updates

The sports fields update was given by Stew Rutledge.

Stew informed all members that:

- All natural grass multipurpose fields except Walnut Grove South, Las Posas Upper and Bradley Park MP #2 are closed from June 1 through July 31 for rest and renovation. During this time Public Works will be replacing approximately 30,000 square feet of sod.
- Bradley Park field 5 dugout and home plate are in process of being repaired. Field 4 is scheduled to have the outfield leveled and approximately 55,000 square feet of sod installed.



The project is projected to begin on July 5, Stew mentioned that two weeks prior YSC members will start to notice current grass dying and yellowing to allow for easier removal.

- Sunset and Bradley arena netting will be replacement project has been approved.
- Connors Park synthetic turf (Nov. /Dec. '22) and basketball court resurfacing (Aug. /Sept. '22) are on track. Public Works will also be replacing south side netting with a thicker gauge to prevent tears.
- MSP windscreen replacement will take place as soon as product arrives late June/early July.
- Stew reported that VWD irrigation conservation policy is in place and that we may see Firmer / dryer field conditions. Public Works is able to water three times per week now so grass should start to look better.

Palomar College-Soccer Game Days

Daniel Lynds (Palomar College Athletic Director) provided contact information for Cara Heise (Sports Information Specialist) if any YSC members wanted to schedule an YSC game day during one of Palomar College Soccer team games at Minkoff Field to involve the youth with their program.

Park Rangers

Eric provided the Park Ranger hotline phone number (760-744-9494 ext 3707) to all members. He reminded all members that if they need assistance with another organization on their allocated fields to contact City staff or the Park Ranger hotline. If they encounter any public safety issues at the parks to contact the Sheriff's Department non emergency line (760-510-5200) or 911 depending on the severity of the incident.

Registration Numbers

Eric reminded all YSC soccer organizations that he needs to collect all club numbers broken down by teams and age groups. Eric reminded all soccer organizations that the recreation participation numbers are due on the third Monday in June.

Youth Sports Tournaments

SMU/Albion and SMYS/ City SC San Marcos tournaments are approved. SMU/Albion confirmed they will host games on Friday. SMYS/ City SC representative was not sure if they would schedule any Friday games and should know closer to the tournament date.

Connors Park Gates

Eric notified all YSC members that the northwest gate at the Connors Park multipurpose field will remain unchained to allow for another exit point. This change is effective as of June 4.
