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MINUTES

Regular Meeting of the Parks and Recreation Commission

CALL TO ORDER

At 6:01p.m. Parks and Recreation Commission Chair Franklin called the meeting to order.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Chair Franklin led the Pledge of Allegiance.

ORAL COMMUNICATIONS

Request to Speak- Kristine Frederico resident of San Marcos for 13 years spoke to the Commission regarding the dog park at San Elijo Park that she uses daily. She noted the neighborhood has grown and flourished and it has become apparent that the dog park is not big enough to accommodate the dogs in the neighborhood. When the dog park gets crowded residents allow their dogs off leash to run on the grass areas near the dog park, on the ballfields and other park areas.

Kristine asked the Commission to consider expanding the dog park to the land on the north west side of the dog park. It could be doubled in size of the dog run area and could give large and small dogs more area to run and play. The trees and vegetation provide a sound barrier to the three homes on Crystal Court that back up to this area. Kristine was able to gather 127 signatures in favor of the expansion from people using the dog park in the past two weeks.

Kristine thanked the City for upgrades to the dog park including trees for shade, fixing the water fountain that used to create a muddy puddle, and new grass.

Chair franklin thanked Mrs. Frederico for bringing this information to the Commission and the Commission can't act on this but it will take this into consideration at a later date and City staff will be in touch as well.

VOLUNTEER RECOGNITION

The Commission recognized Tim DeSilver who started skateboarding around five years old and it's been his whole life ever since. He still has friends to this day from the first time he went to the skate park. He moved to California a few years ago to skate the beautiful parks and become a part of the bigger community that Southern California has to offer. When he moved to San Marcos, he started skating at Hollandia Park and quickly became close with everyone there. As he became a regular, he noticed the kids had barely an hour after school every day to skate and was concerned with what these kids were doing with their time otherwise. He knew he needed to step in and try to give these kids something better to do with their time. Working with the Parks & Recreation department, he advocated for extended park hours and the lights be turned on after dark for more skate time. Since the implementation of extended hours and the subsequent maintenance and repairs, a few of the skaters collectively got together at the high school and have created a successful after school skating and film program. The sport of skateboarding has done so much for Tim and the people around him that he felt it was his turn to give back to the next generation of skaters.

Director Martin will deliver his recognition to Tim since he was not able to attend the meeting.

REPORTS AND OTHER BUSINESS

3. Annual Report

Rebecca Kingsbury, San Marcos Lacrosse, gave the presentation for herself and Tory, the Boys Coach.

Rebecca is the Director of the San Marcos Girls Lacrosse program and took over the program before it was completely dissolved. Rebecca is also the head coach at San Marcos High School and she works closely with the parents and students to keep the program running. When Rebecca took over, there was only 12 girls in the program and scraped together enough for one team and this year they are close to 60 girls playing and have appropriate age groups to play in each division. The boys program had about 60 and this year close to 90 and next year is anticipating 120.

Rebecca and Tory applied for a grant through USA Lacrosse and were awarded 70 lacrosse sticks and lacrosse equipment is fairly expensive so it really helped and they were able to hold their tournament in December at Connors Park.

Rebecca noted that James and Eric are easy to work with and are so flexible with her club and they are continuing to bolster her club working with the high schools and community.

Chair Franklin thanked Rebecca for her report, Commissioners asked questions and Rebecca answered.

4. Public Works Sports Field Presentation

Public Works Manager, Tim Selke presented the report.

Tim told the Commission he oversees parks and landscape and wanted to share information on the sports fields and multipurpose fields, grass maintenance and more. The multipurpose fields have two formal closures per year including a winter closure January and February for the grass to rest and rejuvenate and heal. A renovation period happens in July and August and those periods have active renovations like aeration and renovation of the fields. The work in the summer time is also based on the Bermuda grass sod as that is when it is harvested and actively growing. There is no set closures for the baseball fields but in coordination with the user groups they will close the fields for renovations when they are not in use.

On occasion a park or field will need renovation and require a closure which is what is happening at Bradley Park in mid-July on field 4 as it has some settling in the outfield and causing significant mounds and depressions so the sod will be removed and the field leveled to make it a flat playable surface again.

Exciting news that will take place in November is Connors Park will receive complete removal and replacement of the synthetic turf and the field will be lined for multiple sports to allow for use by more user groups including soccer. Another project that is getting underway now is fields to be placed in the Rancho Tesoro community and will be complete early 2023.

Chair Franklin thanked Tim for his information presented tonight.

Commissioner Robles asked if the closure for Bradley Park will allow for opening of softball. Tim noted it will be ready for that as the project will likely take 3-4 weeks. Tim also noted that improvements to the dugouts at the upper fields will be expanded next year.

Chair Franklin suggested educating the community through social media to let the community know about these closures. Tim noted that we can let the community know and also tell the story of "why" so the community knows the benefits and how it makes the fields be in good shape for its user groups.

Commissioner Sensmeier what is the lifespan of synthetic turf. Tim noted is it approximately 10 years but does depend on how much use it gets.

Commissioner Mockus-Valenzuela is excited to hear about the dugout expansion for Bradley and asked if there is an opportunity to post signage at the park letting the community know why the fields are closed and what improvements will be coming and post them in English and Spanish. Also, making an announcement at the 4th of July event will help to spread the word about the upgrades.

Commissioner Robles noted a re-grand opening or ribbon cutting could happen and communications should be getting this information out to the public and this highlights the importance of having a communications department to manage this for the different City departments.

Chair Franklin asked about the drought tolerant grass and how that works. Tim said the grasses are hybrid species and the nursery's cross different varieties of grass and have grass that are less needy on water and the grass we have is Bandera and is a variety and designed to be drought tolerant.

Director Martin noted his department will work with the Office of Communications to get the word out to the public about the field closures.

5. Annual Staff Report- Aquatics

Katherine (Kat) Trost, Recreation Supervisor gave the report.

Kat provided an overview of the aquatics division at Las Posas and Woodland Pools including aqua aerobics, open recreation swimming, lap swimming, pool parties, user groups, water safety events and more.

Kat told the Commissioners some of this year's highlights include programming at two locations, average swim lesson ratio of 1:5 and offering morning, afternoon and weekend sessions. Success with recruiting knowledgeable and certified staff, increased pool party rentals and private rentals with the inflatable obstacle course. Increased promotion of water safety and drowning prevention efforts. A few challenges included the closure of Las Posas Pool for about 30 days as the pool heater failed, Woodland Pool slide closed until it is fixed and inflation has been a huge burden.

Kat noted that Las Posas Pool revenues are \$85,000 and Woodland Pool is \$44,500 and expenses are \$110,600 for Las Posas and \$59,500 for Woodland Pool.

Aquatics events include April Pool's Day, Water Safety Day and coming up on June 23rd is the World's Largest Swim Lesson in conjunction with the Prevent Drowning Foundation of San Diego and Josh the Otter.

Kat discussed a few of her other duties including social media for the department facebook group and other City social media platforms, City website editing, print media, maintaining partnerships with CSUSM, SMUSD and Boys and Girls Club of San Marcos. July is Parks Make Life Better Month and the department has created a Passport campaign that will be a tour of our City and is geared towards youth but adults can participate as well.

Commissioner Robles commended Kat for her approach with promoting her programs and thanked her for the excellent presentation. Robles took advantage of swim lessons through mommy and me through level 4 with the City and she enrolled in the adult swim lessons herself and she learned to swim and went to Cancun and jumped off a cliff for the first time in her life.

Commissioner Mockus-Valenzuela noted only some of the City events are on the City calendar and suggested adding all the events on there as it is another avenue for the community.

6. Park Naming Policy

Director Martin noted this is with the City Manager and City Attorney and he has updated the application to reflect the department name change. Once he has a timeline for this he will let the Commission know.

7. Youth Sports Council Meeting Minutes- June 7th

Commissioners reviewed the minutes and thanked James and Eric for the amazing work they do.

8. Trails Advisory Committee (TAC)

Assistant Director, Andrea Gonzalez noted we did receive one application late last night so it will be coming at the next meeting.

Andrea noted we are in the process of updating our translation services for the City and our Economic Development Department is forming a language access plan. Commissioner Robles asked for an update on a regular basis on this. Andrea noted we will update the Commission through the Directors Report as it evolves.

PARKS AND RECREATION DIRECTOR REPORT

Director Buck Martin informed the Commission on department events and updates.

Director Martin noted the Friends of San Marcos Parks & Recreation received \$80,000 from the neighborhood grant from the County Supervisors Office that will go towards the Bradley Bike track that is going out to bid tomorrow.

The department currently has four full time position vacancies. Brian Thill and Catherine Manis have received other positions.

Bike to Work Day was very successful with over 50 participants and Trails Day was amazing and had about 500 participants with the hike, bike and equestrian components.

4th of July fundraising is still underway but we are short about \$5,000 and are still seeking new donations and are working with other City Departments to raise funds.

We have received a few complaints from neighbors at Simmons Park and we are working closely with the Sheriff's Department and City Rangers are patrolling.

WRITTEN COMMUNICATIONS

Commissioners Diaz, Lindsay, and Smith emailed their absence for tonight's meeting.

ORAL COMMUNICATIONS

Commissioner Robles will be absent in July.

Commissioner Mockus-Valenzuela noted in thinking about the take action with older youth getting involved and active in the City she wanted to get the word out about getting equipment checkout at our parks and finding ways to engage the youth in the City. We have so many developments and apartments going in and looking for next summer to figure something out to provide the equipment for the youth to informally recreate in our parks.

Commissioner Sensmeier will not be at the July meeting. She will attend the Youth Sports Council meeting in September. She will be attending the General Plan meeting tomorrow night.

Chair Franklin congratulated Commissioner Robles for receiving the Excellence in Business award for the San Marcos Prevention Collation. Franklin thanked Commissioner Sensmeier for attending all the General Plan meetings.
