MINUTES

Regular Meeting of the Parks and Recreation Commission

DATE - WEDNESDAY, JUNE 21, 2023

CALL TO ORDER

At 6:00 p.m. Parks and Recreation Commission Chair Franklin called the meeting to order.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Chair Franklin led the Pledge of Allegiance.

CONSENT CALENDAR

1. Approval of Minutes, 5/17/2023

MOVED BY COMMISSIONER SMITH, SECOND BY COMMISSIONER MOCKUS-VALENZUELA AND CARRIED TO APPROVE CONSENT CALENDAR ITEM #1 AS PRESENTED. DIAZ ABSTAINED.

2. Approval of General Facility Scheduling, 6/22 – 7/19/2023

MOVED BY COMMISSIONER SMITH, SECOND BY COMMISSIONER ROBLES AND CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY TO APPROVE CONSENT CALENDAR ITEM #2 AS PRESENTED.

REPORTS AND OTHER BUSINESS

3. Annual Report- SM Lacrosse

Presentation was canceled due to a last minute scheduling conflict. The presentation has been moved to October 18th, 2023.

4. Annual Staff Report- Aquatics

Aquatics Supervisor Stephanie Wilson gave the presentation.

The Aquatics Program offers two pool locations, Las Posas and Woodland, which both opened as of last week. The program is an affiliate of the American Red Cross. All lifeguards are certified by the American Red Cross. Up to 8 lessons at a time, 6 days a week. The department offers learn-to-swim programs, annual splash passes, water safety events, and cabana rentals. Online cabana rentals are now available through ActiveNet.

The Woodland location offers a water slide and diving board which is great for middle school age and above. Las Posas has the splash pad for younger swimmers. Aquatics also offer group and private lessons, junior guard prep course, and end-of-the year pool parties for the local schools. Both locations have knowledgeable and certified staff. This year, many of the certifications were done in house, including the lifeguard instructor certification. Lifeguard certifications are usually \$250, which is an upfront cost applicants usually have to incur before obtaining employment. Having certified instructors allowed for lifeguards to be certified in-house for free, allowing for better recruitment and employment opportunities. Staff also participates in weekly all-staff trainings.

Stephanie shared some challenges the program has been encountering as well as successes. A significant challenge is the older facilities at both locations. This year Las Posas Pool received a new heater, which is great for the baby shark participants. New furniture was also installed at Las Posas Pool which added additional seating options. Additionally, the water slide at Woodland Park was fixed, which is quite popular with swimmers.

Successes this year were, new hires through referrals and additional programming. Year over year swim lesson totals for June have steadily increased. Upcoming summer events for Aquatics include: World's Largest Swim Lesson- June 22nd and Family Swim Nights with the inflatable obstacle course.

Additional events include: Aqua Aerobics/Swim for Fitness, American Red Cross certifications offered for the community (lifeguards, CPR/AED/First Aid, and babysitting courses), Swim Team and Splashball (Intro to water polo).

Stephanie also presented on the team's marketing efforts. She noted the different social media campaigns and use of updated graphics and photos. The team is also conducting e-blasts to promote events to the community and using booths at events to promote participation. Marketing efforts include newsletters that goes out once a month and quarterly recreation guides.

Commissioner Franklin thanked Stephanie for the presentation. Smith asked about the lifeguard training and the cost. Stephanie explained it is free to those who work for the City of San Marcos. She thanked staff for being innovative and training staff.

Commissioner Mockus-Valenzuela asked about Las Posas Pool and Woodland Pool being out of splash passes. Stephanie advised the pass cards will be available again soon, for now families can check in with their name and in the future hopes to automate the check-in process with the use of new ActiveNet features. She also asked about year round programming and if the pools will be open 365 days a year. Stephanie clarified Las Posas was closed due to the broken heater and Woodland Park remained open. Las Posas is more ideal to have open during the off season because it has lighting and can allow for afternoon programming when it's dark.

Commissioner Mockus-Valenzuela asked about the age groups for the swim team and Splashball, to which Stephanie summarized that the swim program goes up to age 13. Commissioner Mockus-Valenzuela hopes to have programs in the future that target the 14-17 year olds due to limited participants allowed in the local high school teams.

Chair Franklin-asked about ActiveNet generating the passes and Stephanie explained it is in the plans to look at options to change the existing pass process.

Commissioner Sensmeier asked about the 6 month old program. Stephanie summarized the program to highlight water safety, getting used to the water through exercises.

Commissioner Robles asked about the analytics and data reporting for the different social media campaigns as well as other efforts Parks and Recreation is conducting outside of social media. Stephanie mentioned the different platforms currently used and reporting options. The department is also working on general outreach through booths, paper advertising, and the electronic options. Concentrated efforts have also been made to translate flyers and other City advertising to Spanish. Commissioner Robles wanted to remind staff that it is important to streamline processes outside of the digital options for those that may not have access to a computer or other electronic devices. Stephanie agreed and mentioned the department will take that in mind as they move forward with changes in processes and programming.

Commissioner Mockus-Valenzuela commended all the lifeguards and how well organized all the programming was. All the staff was very engaged and nice to see everyone there.

Chair Franklin asked about pricing for inflation and minimum wage, Stephanie mentioned wage increases by neighboring jurisdictions have created a recruiting challenge. To stay competitive the minimum wage for guards has been increased. He thanked her for all her efforts and program success in such a short period of time.

5. YSC Meeting Minutes

Commissioner Robles asked about SM Unified School District participation in the meetings. She noticed they have been missing from several meetings. Assistant Director Gonzalez mentioned they have been invited to every meeting. However, internal turnover has prevented them from participating some months. They attended the February and May meeting, but missed June due to graduations.

Chair Franklin asked about last month's inquiry for the formal field cancelation process since the different groups were reminded to cancel field use. Assistant Director mentioned there has been efforts in the past to find a software that can assist, but it has not met the needs of the department.

Commissioner Diaz asked what the software was missing. Assistant Director Gonzalez advised she has not participated in recent demos, so the best person to answer the inquiry was the sports staff. However, there are efforts now to implement a process that is automated. Chair Franklin would like to see the department leveraging the benefits of technology whenever possible.

6. Sprockids San Diego Commercial Use Application

Commissioner Mockus-Valenzuela asked about the application missing from the June Packet and Chair Franklin had a question about the application date as compared to the Facilities Scheduling, given the date of the scheduled activity.

Assistant Director Gonzalez confirmed the application was missing due to an oversight but the recommendation was to approve. Commissioner Mockus-Valenzuela also asked if the group had a speaker and if staff was familiar with the class. Assistant Director Gonzalez provided a summary of the class and Recreation Coordinator Krystal advised that the class has been hosted before and approved. A copy of the application was visually displayed to the Commission. Chair Franklin also had questions about the Q2 & Q4 dates in the application. Staff advised that the application has multiple quarters that the applicant can use for commercial applications. The application was late given that one of the quarters had already started.

MOVED BY COMMISSIONER ROBLES, SECOND BY COMMISSIONER SMITH AND CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY TO APPROVE CONSENT CALENDAR ITEM #6 AS PRESENTED.

7. 4th of July Fundraising Committee

Assistant Director Gonzalez provided an update to the 4th of July fundraiser efforts. The department has raised a total of \$18,130. Both the paper mailings and email campaigns have resulted in great participation. Several local businesses have made very impactful donations.

8. Park Naming Policy Update

Assistant Director Gonzalez advised that there is no update from City Manager's Office.

9. PARKS AND RECREATION ASSISTANT DIRECTOR REPORT

Assistant Director Gonzalez informed the Commission on department events and updates.

Summer programing has been in effect for a week now, hundreds of kids are participating in the different camps.

Adventure Day Camp had their Bolero Bowling field trip.

Trails Day was a success with many participants.

The first summer movie which was held at Woodland Park, had over 100 participants. Additional options will be offered through the summer. July 21st, at Bradley Park.

The Summer Concert Series kicks off June 24th with Skelpin at The Wood House in Woodland Park.

The Nature Center had 300 drop in visitors during one weekend, making it a now well-known City gem.

The 4th of July event will have the participation of Betamaxx for the musical entertainment, 10 food and beverage vendors, obstacle course, jump house, lawn games, and fireworks. The fireworks program is set to start at 9pm.

Renovations at Walnut Grove Park and arena are expected during this summer.

Redevelopment of Simons Park is also underway, with the park being open to the public, but playground areas closed at this time. The park is expected to open July 17th.

The Bradley Park project for San Marcos Youth Softball for new bullpens is underway and should be completed in July. In May, the City partnered with a contractor to replace 55 feet of sewer line to assist with the ongoing plumbing issues. The old concession stand is set to be demoed under the CIP group projects, there is currently no timeline established for that project.

There is a final public work shop for the restaurant row development on June 29th at 6pm, at the Community Center.

Commissioner Mockus-Valenzuela asked about the over growth of poison oak on the trail at Discovery Lake. Assistant Director Gonzalez will reach out to park maintenance at public works to have that addressed.

Chair Franklin asked about commissioner expectations for the 4th of July event. Assistant Director Gonzalez advised it is a voluntary event and the participation for making an announcement about the ongoing fundraising for the fireworks is always welcome.

Chair Franklin also asked about the future zip line at one of the parks and asked if there were two in the works. He was under the impression the Mayor might have mentioned a second zip line. Staff advised there is only one zip line in the works. He also asked about any programming planned for South Lake. Staff advised

that nothing is planned at this time. Potential fishing camps were discussed, but the cost to maintain fish in the lake as described by Ranger Supervisor Taylor, pose a challenge from both an environmental standpoint and financial perspective.

Chair Franklin asked about the plan to stock the lake since the population is decreasing. At the direction of Director Martin and Assistant Director Gonzalez, Taylor shared programs available through the California Department of Fish and Wildlife that have been discussed by the Department, but the cost to run a program is approximately \$100K in addition to having to update Municipal codes to align with the program.

Chair Franklin hopes that programming can be introduced in the future and for the population of fish to be increased at the lake through environmental friendly projects.

Chair Franklin asked about the park that will be part of the restaurant row project and potential naming. Assistant Director Gonzalez advised the timeline will most likely be next spring, after all of the council approval requirements.
